Thank you for your interest in the Open Buffalo Emerging Leaders program.

Our mission at Open Buffalo is to advance racial, economic, and ecological justice. We do so through skill-building, network-connecting, and activating leadership opportunities. Our goal is that all communities in Western New York are thriving free from discrimination and poverty.

The Emerging Leaders program is a distinctive social justice curriculum aimed at building a stronger Buffalo and WNY by preparing new grassroots leaders in our region. If you are accepted into the program, you will participate in training sessions, learn new skills, and build a network of movers and shakers.

The Emerging Leaders program is highly competitive. Not everyone who applies will be selected this year. The cohort size is limited to provide the ideal learning environment. Applications will be accepted and evaluated on a rolling basis through 11:59PM March 31. If you make it to the next round, you will receive a follow-up email from the Open Buffalo leadership development committee and will be asked to an interview. Those not selected will be notified, and they will be highly encouraged to participate in other Open Buffalo workshops and trainings, and to reapply next year.

All applicants must be able to commit to the full schedule at the time of application. The program runs from July through November 2025, beginning with a three-day rustic camp retreat July 17-19. Workshops will take place every Thursday evening from 6-8pm, beginning July 30, plus full-day workshops on the first and third Saturdays each month from August through the week before Thanksgiving. The capstone project for the course is a team-based community organizing project. Program graduation is Friday, November 20 from 6-9pm.
